<b>SYSTEM DESCRIPTION:</b>	Waterless Waste - Treatment System for Use in Small, Low-Use Toilets in State Reserves.
<b>SPECIFICATION:</b>	As included in the supporting documents.
<b>SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS:</b>	Application of 16 December 1997 and supporting documents. Letter of 16 March 1998. Letter of 16 April 1998.
<b>CONDITIONS OF ACCREDITATION:</b>	<p>The system is constructed and maintained in accordance with the technical details outlined in the application and the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Waste contained in the system shall at all times be treated as hazardous waste, with installation, maintenance and servicing of the system to be carried out by suitably trained and equipped Parks and Wildlife Services employees.</li><li>• The disposal of solid waste from the system shall be carried out by persons licensed under the relevant State legislation to handle and carry hazardous waste of a biological nature. Solid waste removed from the system shall be discharged to a refuse disposal site that is permitted under the <i>Environmental Management and Pollution Control Act 1994</i> to accept hazardous waste.</li><li>• The disposal of the liquid drained from the system shall be carried out in a manner unlikely to pollute the water table or the environment, or impact on public health, all to the satisfaction of a qualified environmental health officer.</li></ul>
