BOOK NOW FOR INFORMATION SEMINARS ON NEW BCA ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROVISIONS

Purpose

This News Update is to up date the *Building Regulation News Update No. 6/2004* on seminars being held in 2005 on energy efficiency provisions for multi residential buildings.

Content of seminars

The seminars will be looking at the changes and new energy efficiency provisions for multi residential buildings Class 2, 3 & 4 buildings. It will also be introducing a new Section on Energy Efficiency (Section J). Other areas to be covered are:

- Building fabric
- External glazing (including use of the glazing calculator)
- Building sealing
- Air movement
- Lighting and power
- Hot water
- Access for maintenance
- HVAC

A satchel will be given out on the day, containing: CD-Rom, glazing calculator, modules, Power Point presentation, hard copy of modules, climate map, BCA subscription and relevant literature.

On 22nd and 23rd March 2005, half-day information seminars regarding the new provisions for energy efficiency will be conducted in Tasmania. All seminars will be held in the afternoon 2:00pm – 6:00pm and will include afternoon tea.

New Energy Efficiency Provisions for Multi Residential Buildings INFORMATION SEMINARS

Important new energy efficiency provisions for multi residential buildings are coming into effect in BCA 2005 on 1 May 2005. As practitioners you need to know about these changes to Class 2, 3, and 4 buildings.

The ABCB, and the Australian Greenhouse Office, in partnership with State and Territory Governments are running a series of seminars near you in early 2005 to inform you of these changes to the Building Code of Australia (BCA).

The objective of the seminars is to present you with the facts and know-how to successfully apply the energy provisions of the BCA.

If you are involved in designing, building or approving multi residential buildings you need to know how these provisions will affect the way you work.

The aim of these provisions is to reduce the emission of greenhouse gases, and as a building operative you have a vital role to play today for the future.
