NEW ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROVISIONS FOR MULTI RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS – TRAINING SESSIONS

Purpose

This Newsflash is to advise building practitioners of training sessions in relation to the new energy efficiency provisions in the BCA for multi residential buildings.

Content of awareness session

The training sessions are being presented by the Australian Building Codes Board (ABCB) and the Australian Greenhouse Office (AGO) in partnership with the Department of Infrastructure, Energy and Resources and will include a training session to explain the new energy efficiency provisions in the BCA for Class 2, 3, and 4 buildings.

Who should attend?

The training sessions are for commercial builders; building designers, building services designers, architects, HVAC installation and maintenance contractors, building surveyors assessing compliance of buildings with the BCA and owners of multi residential buildings. Private building surveyors and energy management professionals involved in the provision of advice to either owners or designers may also find the training sessions useful.

Does the training count towards continuing professional development?

By attending the training sessions you may be eligible for 4 hours in CPD points towards accredited building practitioners continuing professional development requirements.
