
How To Renew Practitioner's Restricted Electrical Work Licence

Occupational Licensing Act 2005

To continue to perform restricted electrical work you must hold a current electrical practitioner's licence.

Commencing 1 September 2009, an electrical practitioner whose licence has been approved for renewal will be issued with a photo ID card.

All applicants who reside in Tasmania

- Will be required to lodge their renewal application and pay the licence fee at any Service Tasmania shop.
- When lodging your application:
 - (a) you need to complete all personal details, answer all questions applicable and have your application signed and witnessed.
 - (b) establish evidence of identity by providing an original of one of the following documents listed below to the Customer Service Operator (CSO) for verification:
 - Australian Driver's Licence
 - Firearm Licence
 - Overseas passport
 - Credit or Bank Account Card
 - Centrelink or DVA Card
 - Australian Trade Certificate
 - Australian Marriage Certificate
- The CSO will:
 - accept your application;
 - verify that you are the person listed on the application by confirming your evidence of identity;
 - record your details;
 - receipt your payment/issue receipt; and
 - take your photograph.
- Your application will be forwarded to Workplace Standards Tasmania for processing.
- You will initially receive confirmation that your licence has been renewed and within 10 – 15 business days from receipt of your application at WST, your photo ID card will be forwarded to you.

Please remember to allow sufficient time when lodging your application at Service Tasmania shop to reach Workplace Standards Tasmania prior to the expiry date listed on your renewal application. If the application is received after the expiry date you will incur a late fee. (Refer to Fees listed below)

Applicants who reside Interstate or New Zealand

- Must provide an original passport photo certified by a Justice of the Peace or Commissioner of Declarations (this photo will appear on your licence card). Please refer to Page 2 for listing of Commissioner of Declarations.
- Must provide a copy of their driver's licence.
- Mail your renewal application together with licence fee payment (cheque/credit card details) and certified passport photo to Workplace Standards Tasmania, PO Box 56, Rosny Park, Tas 7018.
- You will initially receive confirmation that your licence has been renewed and within 15 – 20 business days from receipt of your application at Workplace Standards Tasmania, your photo ID card will be forwarded to you.

Fees

The licence fee that applies to practitioners who wish to continue working in Tasmania is **\$239.40** (\$199.50 for the three-year licence and a \$39.90 application fee). There is no GST component in these fees. This will licence a practitioner for a period of three years. Applications received within 2 months after the commencement date of the new licence term, will incur a late application fee of \$66.50, making the new total payable for your licence **\$266.00. Renewal Period** - The licence renewal period is for three years.
