

## The Generic Continuing Professional Development Scheme

This scheme requires building practitioners to obtain 30 points per year. One point equates to an hour of activity. The content must be relevant to the category of your accreditation.

### 1. Industry Involvement

A minimum of 5 points and a maximum of 15 points are to be obtained from the following group of activities.

A maximum of 5 points may be obtained from any single activity.

- Subscription to the Building Code of Australia (1 point maximum)
- Membership of an industry Association (1 point maximum)
- Attendance of trade shows, industry meetings and non-technical conference sessions
- Preparation of lectures, technical papers and industry award entries
- Structured study tours
- Active participation in discussion groups
- Service to the industry

### 2. Private Study

A maximum of 10 points may be obtained from informal private study

### 3. Formal Study

At least 10 points are to be obtained from the following group of activities:

- Active participation in training workshops
- Formal face-to-face training (includes relevant Adult Education)
- Distance education
- On the job training
- Short courses
- Academic courses
- Attending seminars and presentations of technical papers

Up to 5 excess Group 3 points (half your annual requirement) may be transferred to the following year.

Group 1 and Group 2 points are not transferable.
